The Wilmington Weather Station is very unique because we are a Community Weather Station.

What is a Community Weather Station?

- A Community Weather Station is one that was created by a community or a community non-profit organization.
- A Community Weather Station is one that is managed and operated by community residents and volunteers.
- A Community Weather Station owns its weather and air quality monitoring station equipment.
- A Community Weather Station provides real local weather and air quality information.
- A Community Weather Station also has a website that provides other important weather, air quality, climate change and emergency preparedness information.
- A Community Weather Station supports local Student Career Internship Programs.

The Wilmington Weather Station was established in 2019 by the Coalition For A Safe Environment a non-profit Environmental Justice Organization as a community service. The Coalition For A Safe Environment (CFASE) was established in Wilmington in April 2001 by Wilmington residents. In 2017 CFASE submitted a Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) grant application to the California Air Resources Board. In 2019 CFASE received a SEP grant from the California Air Resources Board to create the Wilmington Weather Station.
